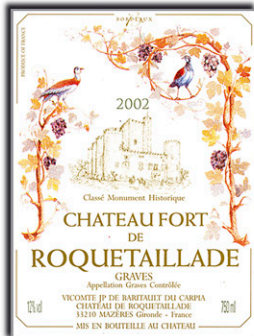




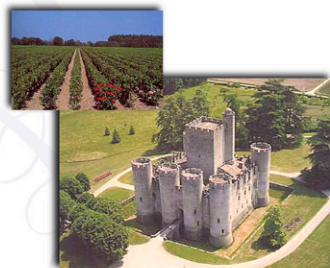

Château Fort de Roquetaillade Graves - Blanc sec

The castle of Roquetaillade, inhabited by the same family for over 700 years, was built in 1306 by Gaillard de la Mothe, the nephew of Pope Clement V.

Much later in history, it was saved from destruction during the French Revolution thanks to its wine. It was finally listed as a historic monument by the Republic in 1840.



The wine

Location: 10 hectares in the commune of Mazères,
53 km south-east of Bordeaux
Soils: clay and limestone and clay gravel
Grape varieties: 50% Sémillon, 50% Sauvignon
Ageing: traditional at low temperatures
Cellaring capacity: to be drunk.

Tasting

A fine, pale green colour.
The nose, dominated by the Sauvignon grape, is floral, intermingling boxwood, blackcurrant and green almond.
Lively, remarkably crisp and fresh on the palate with pleasant floral touches.
A wine with a pleasant liveliness.

Serving

Serve chilled as an aperitif or with oysters or cold cooked fish.
