

Dating back to the 16th century, the Château owes its name to the neighbouring village of Paillet. The symbiosis is complete between a vineyard and its birthplace, giving extra feeling to a wine that remains elegant, subtle and refined throughout the years and always lives up to expectations. This very old vineyard was bought in the 18th century by Squire d'Alphonse, canon of the church of Bordeaux.

THE WINE



Blend

80% Merlot, 15% Cabernet Sauvignon,
5% Cabernet Franc.

Vinification

Cold maceration for a week at 8°C then fermentation
with maceration for 18 days at 27°C.

Ageing

Maturing in barrels and vats.

Ageing potential

Ready to drink now, this wine will reach
its full potential around 2026/2028.

Tasting

Deep purplish colour.
The aromatic nose is already expressive, revealing notes
of dark fruit such as blackcurrants.
The palate is concentrated and dense with velvety tannins and roasted notes.
Delightful, supple finish.

Food Pairing

Perfect with red and white meats, poultry and also with soft cheese.
